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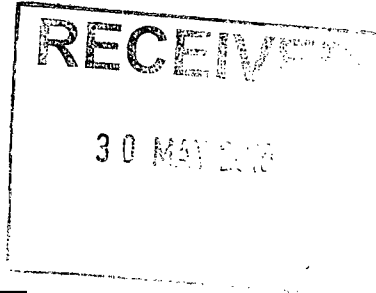

[REDACTED], Spending first half of the consultation on liability and both [REDACTED] say there has been a breach of the duty of care here either in not performing the appropriate medical examination or missing the 3B tear. Noting [REDACTED] specifically uses the word appalling to miss this. Senior Counsel then probes carefully about whether or not there is separate bodies of practice and that some people would ignore the guidelines. [REDACTED] answer was that the guidelines were in place in 2007 because there has been numerous issues of missing pairs and these were reported from 1998 on wards so [REDACTED] would find it inconceivable that any medical expert would stand up and say that this was a reasonable practice. Senior Counsel then probed further about why [REDACTED] was adopting the view he was adopting. [REDACTED] said that it didn't really matter because he simply did not see these tears when they occurred or at a primary basis. [REDACTED] expertise means that he deals with these types of tears on a secondary level and it is simply outwith his expertise to comment upon what happens at the primary tear stage whilst the child was being born. [REDACTED] then states that "she works with him [REDACTED] She loves him dearly and they have collaborated on a lot of these things but he [REDACTED] tends to come down on the side of no negligence in cases. [REDACTED] then "hopes that this remark is not made public" assuring [REDACTED] that it would not be. Senior Counsel then probed again as to why [REDACTED] might reasonably hold this view and whether there is a body of people who would simply not examine properly or not catch the tear upon examination. [REDACTED] explains that they are way above that level and it would be registrar level that would deal with these things day in and day out at this time. However, back in the past [REDACTED] has probably done these examinations at a time and place where the clinical excellence were not available and therefore the ultimate conclusion is that his view must be seen as based as historic based on his experience as an expert way back when these guidelines did not exist. [REDACTED] explains again that he is absolutely clear that there has been negligence here and also comments that [REDACTED] who is the other obstetric expert who has a report

in this case and has been lodged as also confirmed that the liability was indeed a negligent liability. Agreeing that the most likely cross examination strategy against [REDACTED] on liability would be to deal with the fact that he is simply out of touch with the current practice guidelines which have been in place for the last ten years or more. Agreeing that liability looked quite reasonable.

Next half of the consultation went on to deal with the question of causation and a long discussion took place about the client as a reasonable witness. It was clear that the client had mental health issues and [REDACTED] had mentioned that the bowel is sometimes referred to as the small brain and that IBS is a diagnosis of those who are "desitute". By this, she meant that if you had mental health issues and severe anxiety etc this will almost always play havoc with your bowels because it is such a delicate and multi layered and multi factored process. Noting that it is very clear that anyone with mental health issues will have in all probability some issue with diarrhoea or constipation. Going on to look at the medical records and noting that [REDACTED] has made a fundamental mistake in his report saying that there was a diagnosis on 19th September 1992 which is just plainly wrong. It is clear that professor [REDACTED] has read the summary sheet but not actually checked the notes. Another good reason to attack [REDACTED] as the expert as opposed to [REDACTED]. However, in going through the notes again, there is definitely some men
